Mississippi Air National Guard HQ Update

- Meetings are being held daily at the highest levels of the MS Government and attended by MSNG liaisons to assess conditions in the state.
- The current environment is extremely fluid—embrace flexibility!
- Currently, one State Active Duty mission has been assigned to the MSNG
 - The MS ANG has been asked to provide support at mobile testing facilities; more to follow
- Wing/CRTC Commanders have been given utmost flexibility to manage drill weekend execution for their installations. Their plans will take into consideration the priorities listed above.
- ANGRC has clarified the stop movement guidance issued by DoD
 - With few exceptions, all federally-funded official travel has been stopped
 - Waiver authority rests with Maj Gen Nabors; use your chain of command
 - Unofficial travel/movement is not restricted for DSGs, but you are asked to consider the risk and impact to the mission if you choose to travel
 - We HAVE NOT stopped movement to Basic Training and Technical School
 - Bottom line: Just about everything has been cancelled through 11 May 2020. If you think you are traveling somewhere with your unit, double check!
- Bases have implemented a “no-touch” ID check policy at the gates. All three installations have also implemented additional social distancing measures. Be sure to check with your supervisor regarding those measures.
- DO NOT REPORT FOR DUTY if you have a fever or any condition that would cause you to question your normal health – contact your supervisor for guidance.
- DO NOT REPORT FOR DUTY if you have reason to believe you have been in close contact with anyone affected by the COVID 19 virus – contact your supervisor for guidance.
